

How to Us This Journal

This isn't a rule book. It's a talk-it, think-it-through, dream-big kind of journal.

You can check boxes, skip pages, and come back later. There is no wrong way to work through it.
If you are the grown-up, feel free to hand this off, let your kid explore a few pages.

Why This Matters (for Grown-ups)

Before you roll our eyes and say "Sure, when you're 18" it helps to know what your child is growing up around.



Here are a few real numbers to keep in mind.
-81% of US kids ages 8-12 watch
YouTube regularly.

-Children under 13 aren't supposed to have a personal channel - but many use their-parents accounts or shorts.

-Kids ages 5-11 average nearly 5.5 hours of screen time per day.

(Not including school work)




Online comment, likes and views can impact self-esteem especially for kids just learning how to handle feedback.

A YouTube Channel isn't just about videos. It's about identity, attention, and learning to navigate the online world with guidance.

It's here to guide the how, when and why.


